For 2015 we focused on major new investments in education and interpretation services for visitors, significant updates for aging infrastructure, and completion of critical milestones toward the full

opening of the new Castro Adobe State Historic Park. We're also thankful for the great work that came from our strategic partnerships with local organizations such as Mountain Parks Foundation, Waddell Creek Association, Coastside State Parks Association and the Advocates for The Forest of Nisene Marks. In addition, we were proud to participate in California's Parks Forward and State Parks Transformation planning processes, which aim to increase access to State Parks for all Californians. Lastly, we were thrilled to host many fun community events, including the 3rd Annual Mole & Mariachi Festival.

Looking ahead to 2016, Friends will continue to ensure that all local state parks are accessible for all through expanded education and interpretation offerings, increased access to the features of the Castro Adobe, and offering more robust mobile access to park information for visitors. 2016 will also present some major anniversaries worth celebrating, including the 40th anniversary of Friends' founding and the 25th anniversary of Santa Cruz Mission State Historic Park.






2015 was a great year! Thanks to supporters like you, we:

- Funded new Interpretive Park Aide positions at Henry Cowell State Park, Santa Cruz Mission State Historic Park and Seacliff State Beach
- Installed credit card acceptance technology at 15 remote park locations
- Funded new Interpreter positions at Portola State Park, Castle Rock State Park and Half Moon Bay State Beach
- Launched Phase 2 Construction at the Castro Adobe to install an accessible lift, staircase, floor strengthening and seismic stabilization, and restored, furnished and provided interpreted signage for the historic cocina (kitchen)
- Initiated phased opening of the Castro Adobe as a park, including a school field trip program and open house events
- Funded first ever Interpreter positions at Castro Adobe State Historic Park
- Funded trail restoration and replacement of Big Basin State Park's Berry Creek Falls Viewing Platform (partners: Waddell Creek Association, Mountain Parks Foundation and Coastside State Parks Association)

- Funded Henry Cowell State Park Visitor Center exhibit upgrades
- Funded replacement of the Loma Prieta Grade Trail Bridge B3 at The Forest of Nisene Marks State Park
- Funded Fire Road Dust Abatement (partner: The Advocates for The Forest of Nisene Marks)
- Received Conservation Lands Foundation grant to coordinate work day at Coast Dairies State Park (partners: Bureau of Land Management, California Veterans Conservation Corps, PG&E and the Bay Youth for the Environment Program)
- Fully funded five open days per week at Santa Cruz Mission State Historic Park
- Completed new and improved Saltwater Touch Tank at Seacliff State Beach
- Raised final round of funding for painting and repairs at the Wilder Ranch Victorian (partners: Wilder Ranch Docents and New Leaf Community Markets)
- Published Accessible Beaches Guide and Accessible Trails Guide (partner: Hilltromper)
