Thank you for supporting our 34 beautiful state parks and beaches across Santa Cruz and coastal San Mateo counties!

Despite the daunting challenges our community has suffered over the past four years from fire, COVID, and severe weather, the Friends of Santa Cruz State Parks and State Parks team have worked with our community to make tremendous progress for our beloved parks in 2024.

<u>Seacliff & New Brighton</u> – The historic storms of 2023 caused catastrophic damage to our coastal parks, but the recovery process provides an opportunity to be visionary and strategic about how to plan for environmental sustainability in the era of climate change and ensure access. The public planning process is now underway. Please join us at SeacliffResilience.org.

<u>Big Basin</u> – Public access to our oldest state park continues to expand as it recovers from the CZU Fire, with the inaugural summer parking shuttle, reopening of the Butano Trail Camp, and increasing use of the Rancho del Oso campground on the ocean side of the park.

<u>Wilder Ranch</u> – A devastating flash flood this past winter destroyed the park visitor center. Planning for the rebuild is just beginning.

<u>Castro Adobe</u> – On this 35th anniversary of the Loma Prieta Earthquake which nearly destroyed the Castro Adobe, we celebrated the completion of museum qualityexhibits to share the cultural history of the adobe through a theme called "If These Walls Could Talk." Thanks to our community, the adobe has been repaired, restored, furnished, interpreted and is open for the public to enjoy!

<u>Kids2Parks</u> – Our equity park field trip program Kids2Parks is starting its 10th year and is poised to serve more students than ever before thanks to our generous community supporters.

The love and support you show for our parks by visiting and paying your entrance fees, volunteering, donating, becoming a Friends member and shopping in our ParkStores, helps us ensure our parks and beaches are thriving and available to all.

SEACLIFF RESILIENCE & RECOVERY

The coastline is always changing – now possibly faster than ever. The historic storms in early 2023 caused catastrophic damage to our coastal parks, with devastating impacts to core elements of Seacliff and New Brighton State Beaches and the visitor experience. Friends quickly stepped in to create the Seacliff Recovery Fund to support State Parks. Thanks to generous donors we have received support from locals and people from as far away as Maine, Texas, and Oklahoma. CASTRO ADOBE

Interpretive exhibits were installed at Castro Adobe State Historic Park in early 2024. This work is the culmination of years of planning and design to create vibrant, touchable exhibits detailing everyday life in a Mexican era Rancho, highlighting the Castro family experience. The Sibbett Group designed the exhibit plans and Gizmo Art Production brought the story and vision to life. Thank you Monterey Peninsula Foundation and our many generous supporters for making this dream come true!



Other exhibit work included the development of a bilingual video for the Fandango room by Lucid Sound and Picture and Miller Maxfield, Inc. featuring dancers from Alta California Dance Company and music by Los Arribeños de San Francisco to show visitors how the traditional dances looked and sounded.

Friends is kicking off the 10th year of Kids2Parks, a field trip equity program which provides free bus transportation for State Parks field trips serving low-income families in Santa Cruz, San Mateo and Santa Clara counties. This past school year 2,982 students attended 60 in-person field trips and 1,594 attended 47 virtual field trips. To date more than 16,000 students have enjoyed Kids2Parks field trips. 

Friends employed over 100 field staff and 13 program staff. Friends also funded State Parks staff including, 19 facilities development staff and 36 interpretive staff.
